**DISPOSAL OF EMPTY BINS, BOXES AND PALLETS
LEFT AT THE MELBOURNE MARKETS**

Following trading every day, there has been a substantial increase in the volume of rubbish that is being left in the car park and trading areas at the Melbourne Markets. The rubbish includes empty wooden bins, boxes and pallets.

The dumping of these items on the market hardstand is causing difficulties with cleaning of the market and disruption to tenant access to their trading stores. In order to address this issue, as from **Monday the 16th March, 2009**, all empty bins, boxes and pallets left at the Melbourne Markets **after 2.00pm daily** will be disposed of by the Melbourne Market Authority's cleaning contractor.

Market users that own and use these articles in their business please ensure they are secured within their leased areas before leaving the market each day. If they are left outside leased areas they will be disposed of.

The Market Policy Council discussed this action at its meeting on Wednesday 18th February 2009, and resolved to support this change.
